CBMs: Aim and Role

"...to prevent or reduce the occurrence of ambiguities, doubts and suspicions, and in order to improve international cooperation in the field of peaceful biological activities"

- Enhance transparency, strengthen trust & build confidence
- Establish a picture of current activities
- Element of compliance not a tool for verification
- Opportunities for cooperation on peaceful use



CBM D	Deleted (2011 Review Conference)
СВМ Е	Declaration of legislation, regulations and other measures
CBM F	Declaration of past activities in offensive and/or defensive biological research and development programmes
CBM G	Declaration of vaccine production facilities

- Annual submission deadline: 15 April
- Information covering the previous year
- Submission by email
 - Also possible by fax or postal mail
- Published on the restricted website
 - Only CBMs marked as public will also be accessible to the general public


